Well, we all made it . . . bar two more days! It's been a long busy term and even though we were lucky enough to have the extended Easter holiday, we have some pretty tired kids in the school at this end of the term!

Sick days: We're seeing increased numbers of children coming down with colds and coughs. It makes really good sense, wherever possible, to keep them home for a couple of days, get them over it and then send them back to school. Not only does that stop the spread of their bugs, but it also helps the sick child get over being ill a lot quicker.

School holidays: (or as we refer to them . . . "Non-Contact Days"!) During the holidays, our teaching staff are all attending a full day seminar in the "STEAM" Curriculum. STEAM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics. We are joining 75 teachers from throughout our South Wairarapa Kāhui Ako/Community of Learning, upskilling ourselves on the latest tools and strategies for better integrating these curriculum areas into our planning, looking at the latest ideas around engaging learners through robotics and coding, with an emphasis on increasing writing achievement and looking towards future work place skills. I also went to another seminar earlier this term regarding the best tools and devices being used in classrooms across the country and believe me, our wish-list is very long!

Assessment seminar: Next Tuesday, I'll be attending a day-long seminar in Wellington around assessment. With the removal of the National Standards requirement to assess children's progress and achievement against, lead educators across the country are being given the opportunity to engage in conversations around, and have their voices heard, regarding the re-development of how we best assess children's achievement and progress. Within our school, we will be looking at how we report to you as parents and whānau, and so there will be some conversations going on here too.

Working Bee for the playground: Keith Dennis (Jo's husband) has an old boat that he wants to donate to the school. We are going to 'dig' it into the playground for the children to play in and on. Keith has said there is a bit of work to do on it to make it safe, plus of course we'd need a bit of hard work to dig a hole and place the boat. If you are keen to help out, please give the school a ring and I'll collate a list of 'good keen people' and we'll plan a date.

Skool Loop app: A reminder to download the 'Skool Loop' app onto your phone so you can be kept up to date with everything happening at school. (Don't you hate it when they mess with the spelling??)

New lunch menu: As you'll see from the list to the left, we have introduced some new food items for trialling. When I conducted a survey of the school, we had a high number of children who requested a vegan/vegetarian option. Those who have tried the new items have said they are very tasty!

Parent Reading Support: Many thanks to Chris Konig and Alistair Reid who have taken time out of their busy days to come in and work alongside some of learners that need a little extra support with their reading mileage.
