Sadly, we still have a lot of children who are away due to the host of illnesses doing the rounds of Featherston, but hopefully with the holidays coming up, the trend might be broken by the time Tem 3 rolls round.

Combined schools kapahaka for Featherston Matariki Weekend: When I did a mad dash head count of our tamariki while they warmed up in the Supper Room, I think we ended up with 28 tamariki who made it in for the Matariki pre-hangi performance at Anzac Hall last Friday. Thank you so much to all the families who were able to bring their kidlets down! Our uniform colour made it seem there were loads more! The three school group did a phenomenal job (as usual. I was pleased to see a lot of you stayed on for some kai, too. It was such a shame that some of the meat wasn't cooked enough, but I've heard from people who took theirs home to re-cook that it still came out really tasty! I have to say that this year's fry bread was DELICIOUS! I took a couple home, reheated them, lathered butter on them, then poured golden syrup all over them! That's how we used to eat it at my husband's home marae up in the Hokianga, so it brought back great memories. I hope the recipe stays exactly the same for next year's Matariki hangi!

Learning Progress Conferences: This has been our BEST year ever for parents taking up the opportunity to come and meet with their child's teacher, and discuss the progress being made and next steps for the rest of the learning year. The parents of 61 or our 67 ākonga have come along, which equates to 91% attendance. We have our short night tonight, but there are no more spaces left. Their wee girl is 3 now, and Paige began thinking about getting back into teaching. She had done the odd day in Term 1 as well as sorting out our reading resource area, but this term she accepted a oneday-per-week role with us as a learning support assistant.
