Arrival Time at School

Seeing as they are unbudgeted items, we'll need to replace that expense during this school year, so we'll come up with some clever fundraising ideas. If you would personally like to make a

Parent Information Evening: Across last year, our staff did a number of professional learning sessions focussing on what we see coming into our classrooms more and more – childhood depression, anxiety, childhood trauma, to name a few. One of the professionals we worked with was Jenny from CAMHS (Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service). She and I got talking about the potential for planning an information evening early this year for a small number of our school's parents who may have children who face these types of difficulties. Suffering from this type of thing as an adult can be hard; as a child it can be crippling! If you are interested in attending, please contact me. We have scheduled it for Tuesday 12 March, from 7pm. We will provide child care for anyone who needs it as we'd love to see both parents attend!


COMMUNITY NOTICES

PARENT INFORMATION

Kia ora koutou

Welcome to Whare Humarie After School Care which will be starting at Te Kura O Paetūmokai Featherston School from Thursday 08 February 2024. We have Ms Sue Campbell joining us as our programme supervisor from day one. It would be great for you to come in and introduce yourselves so she knows who you are as you sign your children out at the end of the day.

At present we are still waiting to be OSCAR affiliated, hopefully that process will not take too long to come through. I will check up tomorrow with how that is coming along. Until then the charges are as follows:

For the first child: \$7 per hour

For every child after that: \$3.50 per hour

Casual students: \$7 per hour (to be paid upfront online)

Parents who have children attending on a regular basis will have an invoice emailed fortnightly.

Your children will be provided with healthy snacks, fun activities and a safe environment to enjoy the time after school. If the weather is too hot we will open the hall so they have a cooler place to play in. The whole of our campus is open including our playgrounds, bike track and PE equipment.

Please ensure that you sign your children out from the programme when you pick them up as this is a Health and Safety requirement. If you are going to be late or have organised for alternative pick up arrangements please let Sue know prior to pick up. She will give you contact details as she meets you.

South Featherston Parents: we can organise for your students to be met off the bus at the Revans Street crossing once we know the timing so they are able to cross safely.

For enrolment forms please contact the Featherston School Office or look on our website. We will set up social media in the near future.

Whare Humarie is being run through the Te Kura O Paetūmokai Featherston School Board of Trustees as a service to our community. It is not being run as a profit making venture but we do need to ensure we cover our costs. We look forward to your support over the coming year as this is something that the community asked for.
