South Wairarapa Kāhui Ako Y7/8 trip to Wellington: Our SWKA Learning Partnerships 'pillar' has organised an amazing trip to Wellington for a combined group of our Y7/8 students from across the 12 schools which forms our SW Kāhui Ako. Our school is able to send a group of 6 to this, and they will have an incredible day! Among some of the activities planned for them will be a workshop at Capital E (game design constructing an interactive 3D video game set in a world of their creation, complete with puzzles and challenges; an opportunity to work on TV where they will work with a preprepared script to create the 'Wake Up New Zealand' breakfast show; a trip to the Wellington City Gallery for a hands on tour and workshop to explore the knowledge of ringatoi Māori (Wellington region) with a workshop to make a sculptural memento using a range of precious materials. Finally, they will all come back together to have lunch in Frank Kitts Park, then visit the Wellington Museum before heading home on the bus at 1.15pm.

BSLA (Better Start Literacy Approach) Parents information session: Anna will be running her next session for new entrant parents on Tuesday 18 June, from 3.15pm. She will send out invitations to those parents that haven't attended one yet, along with new parents of children who are soon to enrol here.
